# The 74<sup>th</sup> Republic Day

The Representation of work done by Sakhi Mandals received applause at both State and District level.



To commemorate 74 years of the Indian constitution the country celebrated its Republic Day with immense pride and joy on 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2023. On this occasion, to showcase the 'Badalte Rajya Ki Tasveer', the tableaux were taken out by various Government departments at Morabadi ground, Ranchi. The honorable Governor Shri Ramesh Bais presided over the occasion.

## JSLPS got 2<sup>nd</sup> prize at State-level tableau representation

The Jharkhand State Livelihood Promotion Society under RDD, GoJ presented a tableau of different schemes of the Department like Phulo Jhano Aashirwaad Abhiyaan, Baba Saheb Bhimrao Ambedkar Awas Yojana were presented along with the brand Palash and Adiva showcasing Grameen Mahilaon Ki Shram Shakti Ka Sammaan. Through the tableau, JSLPS showed the "Changing picture of rural Jharkhand" through the involvement of Sakhi Mandals. The data replicated the reach of JSLPS, along with the display of ill effects of brewing and selling of Hadia and country liquor over women and children and the prevention of this through PJAA.



In Jharkhand, more than 35 lakh rural women are defining Women empowerment by getting associated with Self Help Groups and ultimately living dignified livelihoods.

The tableau of JSLPS grabbed second position in this function organized on the occasion of Republic Day.

Whereas, In Gumla district, a tableau was presented by JSLPS at the district-level organized program on Witchcraft Eradication which got first place. In West Singhbhum, a tableau related to district-level departmental projects and achievements was displayed which was awarded the second prize. Koderma also stood 2<sup>nd</sup> for showcasing Gram Swalamban Yojana through JSLPS and its different projects implemented for providing livelihood opportunities to rural women. Likewise, Hazaribagh got 2<sup>nd</sup> prize and Godda secured 1<sup>st</sup> position while representing Palash, PJAA and Tractor Didi in its tableau.



## SARAS Mela - Paving the path for excellence in woman entrepreneurship



**Jharkhand SHG women are proving that a little encouragement can help make successful rural entrepreneurs with a national footprint.**

Since its inception, SARAS Mela has provided a stage for rural women entrepreneurs to showcase their skills and a market for their enterprises and expand the reach of their products. Such exhibition-cum-sale fairs, give a chance to customers to know about the variety of products that are produced by local enterprises. In order to promote products made by rural women of Jharkhand, there were two fairs organized under SARAS mela in the Dumka and Ranchi districts of the state.

Palash Aajeevikotsava SARAS Mela was organized from 10th to 20th December in Dumka. This 10-day event was inaugurated by Shri Alamgir Alam, Minister, Rural Development Department and Shri Badal Patralekh, Minister, Department of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Co-operative, Shri Basant Soren, MLA and other prominent dignitaries. More than 150 stalls were set up and women entrepreneurs sold varied unique products. The event concluded with the felicitation of SHG members from Giridih, Pakur, Khunti, Dumka and Sahibganj who exhibited exceptional stall maintenance and sales.

Similarly, a grand exhibition cum sale event was organized in the form of “Rashtriya Khadi Evam SARAS Mahotsava 2022-23” in Morabadi Ground, Ranchi from 28th December 2022 to 08th January 2023. The event was inaugurated by Hon’ble Chief Minister, Shri Hemant Soren in the presence of eminent personalities such as Shri Satyanand Bhogta, Minister, Department of Labour, Planning, Training and Skill

Development, Shri Sanjay Seth, Member of Parliament, Smt. Mahua Manjhi, Member of Rajya Sabha, Smt. Asha Lakra, Mayor, Shri. C.P.Singh, MLA etc.

Hon’ble Chief Minister who was the Chief guest addressing applauded the entrepreneurship of rural women of Jharkhand and said, “We have to adopt swadeshi products, our didis are proving that they are no less in skill. They are making such a vast variety of products which reflect the essence of our state. Such events not only provide them with a chance to showcase their talents but also increase the reach of their products.”





During this entire event, the entrepreneur women from Sakhi Mandals did remarkable sales. Their products ranged from edible items to decorative products to fashion accessories. There were also some unique products such as Madua Flour, Black Wheat Flour, Edible Products made from Mushrooms, Bhagaiya Silk, etc. Sharing her experience of SARAS mela, Meena Devi from Bengabad block of Giridih said, “I have come along with my fellow SHG members to sell items such as Black Wheat Flour, Multigrain Flour, Gram Flour, Millet Flour, etc., under PALASH Brand. This is the first time that I have participated in any such fair. We started the work of production and packaging of Black Wheat Flour this year. This product is unique as it is very beneficial for diabetic patients and has higher dietary fibres than regular wheat flour. Due to its specialty, this product of ours has been in demand at this fair.”

Similarly, Raimuni Kispotta and her fellow SHG members from Ranchi participated in this fair with their famous bakery products as “The SHG Bakers”. Stating her journey from the year 2019, Raimuni shares, “We, a team of 11 women, had never thought that we will come this far when we started our enterprise. The freshness and quality of our products have been our USP. We do not add any kind of preservatives in our food items. For this mela, with the spirit of celebrating International Year of Millets, we have brought forward laddus etc. made from millets such as Ragi, Madua, etc., which were highly in demand by the customers.”

The event concluded in the presence of Hon’ble Governor Shri Ramesh Bais along with Shri Prashant Kumar, Secretary, Department of Rural Development, Shri Suraj Kumar, CEO-JSLPS and other prominent officials.

Addressing the concluding ceremony, Hon’ble Governor Shri Ramesh Bais said, “ Use of Swadeshi products will benefit our rural economy as well as help us in promoting our heritage and culture. We must collectively join hands in this initiative and help realise the goal of bringing the rural enterprises into the mainstream and providing identity to rural products in mainstream markets.”

Shri Prashant Kumar, Secretary, Department of Rural Development shared the achievements of SHG women entrepreneurs in the Rashtriya Khadi & SARAS Mela and said, “The products being manufactured by our rural women entrepreneurs speak quality and assurance. These women are showcasing their talents keeping the essence of their tradition and culture intact. I am happy and proud to share that a total of 126 stalls were set up for these women entrepreneurs and they did a business of Rs 2.25 crores in these twelve days.

Shri Suraj Kumar, CEO of JSLPS also congratulated the women entrepreneurs who participated in the events and applauded them for their skills.

Palash Mart set up by Ranchi district bagged the first prize, Palash Mart set up by Pakur district bagged the second prize and SHG Bakers from Ranchi district got third prize for management and exemplary sales throughout the event. Also, Seraiphool Aajeevika Didi Café was felicitated for their stall in the food court.

### Creating a platform for knowledge sharing

A one-day workshop on Learning, Sharing and Concept Seeding under MKSP was organized by joint efforts of JSLPS and Digital Green at B.N.R. Chanakya, Ranchi.

Md. Arif M. Akhtar, State Program Manager, MKSP, JSLPS started the workshop by stating the objective and vision. He said, "Such workshops should be organised monthly at blocks, quarterly at districts and twice a year at the state level and explained knowledge is power and we should know how to properly utilization of limited resources."

Mr. Ravi Shankar Sharma, Program Director, Digital Green, in his address said, "Knowledge sharing is also important, hence MKSP team from different districts

have participated in this workshop. The objective of this workshop is to bring change by women farmers and to focus on climate-smart farming."

The Digital Green team discussed the work of Digital Green and its partnership with JSLPS, Project ATLAS – its learnings & findings and Project DEEP and the findings of the baseline survey.

At the end of the workshop, the Namkum block from Ranchi was awarded for Digital Advisory Reach, the Latehar block for Practice Adoption and the Daru block from Hazaribagh for Kisan Diary Enterprise as the best blocks.

JSLPS MKSP staff from the state, districts and blocks attended the workshop.

## Sakhi Mandal enable rural women's entrepreneurial dreams

**Sahibganj**



The only source of livelihood for Nasura Khatoun of Sahibganj district was her small business of silk in her village. The income was low and she had to face a lot of difficulties in running the household. She needed capital to expand her silk business, and she found

support from the Sakhi Mandal. She was associated with Noori Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal in Dhanbasa village of Mandaro block from where she took a loan of Rs 1 lakh under the Community Enterprise Fund (CEF) amount through One Stop Facility (OSF) and increased textile production by investing capital in the business.

Now, her business is expanding and her income has increased. Nasura earned a total revenue of Rs 3,20,000/- by selling her products such as silk sarees, silk salwar suits, silk dupattas, etc., representing Jharkhand in Kurukshetra Saras Mela, Haryana. She is very happy as she earned a profit of about Rs 40 thousand at the mela. Nasura is very thankful for getting this kind of opportunity.

## Rural women in Sahibganj are stitching tremendous aspirations together



*Rural women took on the challenge of setting an example for others during the pandemic with the aid of community-based organisations.*

The women of Sakhi Mandal established a stitching unit during the first wave of the Covid-19 pandemic (2020) in the Udhwa block of Sahibganj district with the intention of empowering themselves and guaranteeing financial security.

There are four SHGs and a total of 40 people working in this stitching unit. These ladies are from the Rukaiya Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal, the Farhana Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal, the Yahana Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal, and the Mukhiya Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal.

They have invested Rs 5 lakh out of their own funds and Rs 5 lakh through a Cash Credit Linkage loan. The women of the Rukaiya Aajeevika Stitching Unit

received the first order from the district administration as a first step toward their success. The local administration asked them to sew 50,000 masks. As part of the completion of their second order, they sent 10,000 school uniforms to the district administration in 2020–2021. The district administration appreciated the women for their efforts and again ordered 21,000 school uniforms from them in 2021–2022. They obtained a subsequent order for 16,500 school uniforms in 2022–2023 and were able to effectively deliver them to the district administration. A request for 26,000 flags was made in 2022 during the Har Ghar Tiranga Campaign organised by the Ministry of Rural Development, GoI, for distribution to the State Mission Management Unit, JSLPS, and the district government in Sahibganj.

They recently began producing jute bags, and they also sold jute bags, clothing, and other items at the Palash Aajeevikotsav Saras Mela in Dumka. They received a prize for finishing third in the highest sales category at the mela.

Each member of this sewing unit earns between Rs 70,000 and 80,000 annually.

Currently, all of the members are content with their work and grateful to JSLPS for giving them this opportunity. With the aid of the Sakhi Mandal, these women have not only taken action on their own for personal improvement but have also provided other women with inspiration to think outside the box. Just with their CBO's financial assistance, they accomplished everything independently.



## Timely Vigilance Averts Child Marriage

**Jamtara**



*16-year-old Meenu would have been married off had it not been for the alertness of Active Woman Lakhivilash Murmu in Jamtara*

It was a regular morning when Lakhivilash Murmu sensed something fishy at her village fish market in Hidaljudi village, Jamtara district, Jharkhand. She noticed that Lilmuni Hembrom, a co-resident from her village, was buying fish in unusual larger quantity.

Lilmuni initially evaded Laxmivilash's curiosity. However, repeated probing revealed that the extra fish was for the guests Lilmuni was expecting for prospective matrimonial match for her daughter, Meenu. On further questioning, Laxmivilash found that Meenu was merely 16 years old and was not eligible for marriage yet.

As an Active Woman with JSLPS, Laxmivilash has been associated with Project Umang, being implemented by JSLPS with technical support from PCI India, that is addressing Child/Early Marriage through empowering women's collectives to act at household level and lead purposeful advocacy with the system. She reminded Lilmuni of the multiple sessions she had taken as an SHG member in Gulabbaha Aajeevika Mahila Swayam Sahayata Samuh and their key messages entailing how child

marriage is illegal in India and its ill impact on the health, socio-economic status & overall future of the girl child.

The reminder helped Lilmuni realize that she was on the verge on committing a big mistake. She decided to talk to her husband and finally convinced him not to marry off their daughter early. Meenu has now passed her 10th boards examination and will be enrolling in higher secondary school. She aspires to become a nurse. Had it not been for the alertness of Murmu, Meenu would have probably been married off and deprived of chances for higher education.

Lakhivilash Murmu is among the cadre of Active Women associated with Project and her essential role involves – ensuring that all SHG members participate in Umang sessions; encouraging mothers to participate in household decision making, especially those pertaining to their daughters' future; encouraging mothers to send their daughters to school; informing them about Prohibition of Child Marriage Act and the ill effects of child/early marriage; etc. However, her work doesn't end at those sessions. Rather, she is constantly active, keeping herself apprised of major activities in her respective area.

It is this round the clock vigilance of Active Women and VO members associated with Umang that is helping in generating awareness against child marriage and also facilitating an attitudinal shift among community members as they gradually realise the significance of education of the girl child.

"Being an Active Woman hasn't been easy," shares Laxmivilash. "Initially, I faced a lot of resistance from communities, especially from male members who perceived me as an over smart intruder corrupting the minds of their wives and daughters. However, persistent efforts have built trust and some men now understand the relevance of my work as they are witnessing the improvement in their daughters and other are following suit," she says.

## Afroz got a ray of hope from Self-Help Group

Afroz Khatoon, a resident of Nantilo village, located in Kuru block of Lohardaga district, when she came to her

husband's house after marriage, witnessed a terrible situation. The economic condition of the house was bad. Due to poverty, she was unable to even get two meals a day. Afroz did not have any source of income. She was helpless. She joined the Jharkhand Sahara Mahila Mandal sometime later.

After joining the group when Afroz started weekly savings it boosted her confidence. Gathering courage from the group, she managed to open a cosmetic store by taking a loan of Rs 10,000. With the income earned from it, she slowly started repaying the loan. Her confidence grew with each passing month. After this, she also began a business of selling baskets in the store. Afroz says, "Before opening the shop, I used to face a lot of difficulty in running my house. But now with the help of the group, my life has improved. In a way, today I see myself as a very strong person and capable in every way. The group has given me a chance to lead a respectable life."

## SHGs are helping in fulfilling the dreams of Rural women.

Baby Devi, a resident of Jarga village situated in Koderma Sadar block is a member of Genda Phool Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal and is now working as the Aajeevika Krishak Sakhi (AKS) in her village. Along with that, she has got enough courage with the help of her SHG to try her hands in advanced and scientific agriculture with better equipment and facilities. She took a loan of Rs 25,000 to purchase equipment for farming.

Before joining the group Baby and her family of 5 members were living a life of poverty. The basic needs of the family could not be fulfilled. But now after joining the group her financial condition has improved a lot.

Baby says, "After joining the group in May 2017, I was selected for the position of AKS, for which I have also been given training in advanced farming. I also got a loan from the group, with the help of which I started farming and bought goods as well as equipment. I also bought seeds and saved about Rs 15,000 to 18,000 after the harvest of the first crop. Today my income is up to Rs 1 Lakh to 1.5 Lakh per year. My financial



condition has improved a lot. I have faced many challenges but never gave up. Life has taught me to deal with troubles. Today not only I am earning well but also got lessons and courage from my group to go out of the house for my work. Also, I've got an identity in the village. I want to improve my economic condition by increasing my income from farming.

## Project Resham: Knitting Livelihood opportunities for rural women



*The Mahila Kisan Sashaktikaran Pariyojana is an initiative to enhance the income of women farmers.*

Malti Barjo a resident of Gotomapi village of Tonto block of West Singhbhum and a member of Jyoti Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal is associated with the Mahila Kisan Sashaktikaran Pariyojana since 2019. Before joining the group, she used to work in someone else's field as a wage laborer and was somehow able to feed her family by doing subsistence farming. She says, "Earlier it was very difficult for me to manage the expenses of the family with meagre earnings. Despite hard work, I was unable to do much for my family. In this crisis, my SHG helped me a lot. By getting associated with project Resham under MKSP I started doing Tasar cultivation. After that, I never faced such a situation. Today, from the Tasar cultivation I earn up to Rs 35,000 from a single crop. I am happy that I am capable of managing my home well."

## Project Udaan is uplifting the PVTGs in Rural areas

*Community-Based Organizations are helping PVTG women to grow.*

Sarita Devi, a resident of Nauwka village of Bhandaria block under Garhwa district says, "We are four members in our family. Before joining the Self-Help Group the family went through a lot. The financial condition was so terrible that I along with my husband was working to meet the basic needs of the family but that too was insufficient. We both are illiterate and worked as daily wage labourers to earn a living of about Rs 500-600 per week. After 2019 when we formed an SHG under the guidance of JSLPS we received RF and CIF funds that were provided after Cash Credit Linkage. I took a loan of Rs 30,000 to start a general store, goat farming and poultry farming and bought 4 goats and 20 chicks from the local vendors. I started earning more than Rs 50,000 annually and earn more than Rs 40,000 just from selling Goats.

Currently I have started cultivating vegetables in my Nutrition Garden (Poshan Vatika) under project Udaan and also cultivate various crops commercially on about 2 acres of land using organic manures. My husband stood by me in every struggle of my life. My



kids are now getting a quality education with the help of JSLPS which counselled us and enlightened us to come out of the depressing lifestyle and led us to improve our life. Now we have enough to eat, and also enough for regularly saving for our future."

## Pakur's Tilka Devi gets success through Chaas Haat

**Pakur**



Tilka Devi, who lives in Khidirpur village of Hiranpur block situated in Pakur district, is earning lakhs today by joining the Chaas Haat scheme run by Pakur district administration and JSLPS. Tilka is a member of Shri Ganesh Sakhi Mandal and works as a Aajeevika Pashu Sakhi. To improve her economic condition, she is also doing goatry, poultry and duck rearing. She earns two to three lakh rupees annually by supplying the eggs obtained from ducks to schools and Anganwadi centers. On her success, Tilka says, “These goats, chickens and ducks are my companions in the economic battle. By earning money through them, I completed my daughter's education and today my daughter has fulfilled my dream by getting the post of General Nursing and Midwifery (GNM) in a reputed hospital in West Bengal.”

## With Solar Irrigation Facility, Dulhan Hembram is moving toward economic empowerment

Dulhan Hembram, a resident of Gohanda village under the Littipara block of Pakur district, is increasing her prosperity by taking advantage of the Kusum scheme. She is associated with Marshall Aajeevika Sakhi Mandal. She had cultivable land and water facilities, but due to the irregular electricity and irrigation cost, she was unable to cultivate her land. Under Kusum Yojana (2021-22), she got a solar pump set on a 97% grant. With the help of the pump set, she saved electricity and oil expenses. During Rabi season, Dulhan irrigates her fields with the help of a solar pump set, apart from this she has also earned Rs 3000 to 4000 by giving water to other farmers. She is also involved in Chaas Haat project with the help of JSLPS. Under this, she has cultivated chilli on 50 decimal lands, mustard on 1-acre land. Didi has grown in confidence after joining this project and has become a source of inspiration for other women in the group.

## Easy loans from Sakhi Mandal pave the path to success

Anju Devi of Itkhori block situated in Chatra district was spending her days in household chores and running a small shop selling items of daily need like biscuits, toffee, pencils, etc. She was associated with Bhadrakaali Sakhi Mandal and to expand her shop she decided to take a loan of Rs 16200/ in two instalments. Gradually she kept increasing the goods so that more customers would come. Today she earns Rs. 5 to 6 thousand per month and is living a good life.

## Sakhi Mandal is bringing prosperity in the lives of rural women

### Sahibganj



Kanaklata Sarkar, a resident of East Narayanpur in Rajmahal block of Sahibganj district, was a daily wage labourer and she used to teach in a school earning Rs 700 per month. She joined Devi Sakhi Mandal under the CRP drive, and after a few days, seeing her interest, she was selected as Aajeevika Krishak Sakhi. She started getting Rs 1500 per month. Kanaklata took a loan of Rs 25,000 from the group for farming to increase her livelihood. She says, “At present, the income from farming is around Rs 1 to 1.5 lakh. Whereas earlier our annual income was only Rs 20,000 to 25,000. My financial condition has improved a lot after joining JSLPS.”

## Raimuni gets a reason to live again

**DDU-GKY is not just a scheme ensuring employment to rural youth but also has a role in making them live with respect.**

Raimuni Balmuchu hails from Tentoposi village of Noamundi block situated in West Singhbhum district. Her siblings abandoned her after her parents passed away. Nobody was readily accessible to look after her. Her circumstances left her traumatised. She began begging in the Noamundi market in order to survive.

She developed malnutrition as a result of a lack of food and sufficient nutrition. Her deteriorating health and poverty were noted by JSLPS. And without any delay in the month of November 2022 the mobilisation team of DDU-GKY took Raimuni under the scheme. She sought help shortly after enrolment under the DDU-GKY. She also began her training in the Sewing Machine Operation Trade at Abbey West Services Private Limited in Jamshedpur.

In the past, malnutrition and the trauma of being an orphan prevented Raimuni from even expressing her suffering or speaking up. She received counselling from her PIA as well as medical care while she was enrolled at the DDU-GKY. She has developed mental toughness, and her health is now improving.

Raimuni is content with the way her life is going right now and is optimistic about soon landing a job in the sewing industry.

## News-Brief

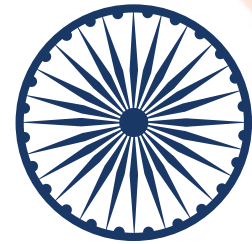
